Dear Parishioners,

**1. The One and the Many**

*In the Gospel Reading, Jesus heals a man who was possessed. But notice that when the demon-possessed man first talks to Jesus, he uses the first-person plural pronoun to refer to himself. He says, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us?"*



*Why does he say 'us'? Why doesn't he say 'me'?*

*The answer, I think, is that although there is only one human body giving voice to these words, there is more than one mind behind the words. That is why that one man's voice says 'us' to refer to himself.*

*When Jesus heals the man, he does so by ridding him of all minds but one, the man's own. In healing him, Jesus makes him single-minded. And so the Gospel Reading calls to our attention what an affliction it is to be double-minded.*

*Even just dealing with the double-mindedness of long bad habit can be miserable and devilishly difficult. Someone says to you when you are trying to diet and not doing particularly well, "Do you want another helping of pasta?" And what is the answer? Do you want more pasta? You do, you know you do, don't you? And yet somehow you really don't either.*

*And so, as we know from our own painful experience, being double-minded is a kind of slavery to our worst selves.*

*Real freedom is being able to do what you want to do. But if you have two minds about something, which mind is the real you? How can there be one real you when you are in two minds about something? That's why you aren't free when you are double-minded. No matter what you do, you aren't doing what you want to do because there isn't just one you.*

*Like the demon-possessed man in the Gospel Reading, you will be free only when you are single-minded. But the demon-possessed man in the Gospel Reading was single-minded only after Jesus had healed him.*

*And so here is the lesson for us. In another Gospel text (John 8:32), Jesus tells his disciples that they will know the truth, and the truth will make them free. For those who will come to Jesus to be freed from their demons, he himself is that healing Truth that will make them free.*

Fr Kelly is celebrating his 60th Anniversary of Priesthood on the 4th March, 2018.


To celebrate, a Mass is being held at 9:30am at Our Lady of the Rosary Church, The Entrance.

# POPE'S COLUMN

## Pope to Economic Forum: Allow Each Person to Live in Dignified Manner

“Offering to all people real opportunities for integral human development”

Pope Francis called on world leaders to promote policies that allow each person to live in a dignified manner. His call came in a statement released by the Vatican on January 23, 2018, addressed to the chairman of the World Economic Forum, meeting in Davos from January 23-26, 2018.



“It is vital to safeguard the dignity of the human person, in particular by offering to all people real opportunities for integral human development and by implementing economic policies that favor the family,” the Holy Father said. “Economic models, therefore, are also required to observe an ethic of sustainable and integral development, based on values that place the human person and his or her rights at the center.”

The Pope noted that the world is witnessing increasing fragmentation between states and institutions, with the emergence of “new actors” and “new economic competition and regional trade agreements”. Added to this are new technologies that transform economic models and “an ambition for profit at all costs.” Leading to “further fragmentation and individualism, rather than to facilitate approaches that are more inclusive.”

Reminding the world leaders of the suffering of millions around the world, Francis lamented that “we cannot remain silent...nor can we continue to move forward as if the spread of poverty and injustice had no cause”. “It is a moral imperative, a responsibility that involves everyone, to create the right conditions to allow each person to live in a dignified manner,” the Pope continued, calling for the rejection of a “throwaway” culture and a mentality of indifference”.

Reflecting a ray of hope for the future, the Holy Father reminded leaders that, “the entrepreneurial world has enormous potential to effect substantial change by increasing the quality of productivity, creating new jobs, respecting labor laws, fighting against public and private corruption and promoting social justice, together with the fair and equitable sharing of profits.

“Now is the time to take courageous and bold steps for our beloved planet. This is the right moment to put into action our responsibility to contribute to the development of humanity.” The young people in the Gospel we heard today wanted that “connection” to help them keep the flame alive in their hearts. They wanted to know how to charge the power cells of their heart. Andrew and the other disciple – whose name is not given, so we can imagine that each of us is that “other” disciple – were looking for the password to connect with the one who is “the way, and the truth and the life” (Jn 14:6). It was John the Baptist who showed them the way. I believe that you too have a great saint who you can be your guide, a saint who made his life into a song: “I am happy, Lord, I am happy”. Alberto Hurtado had a golden rule, a rule for setting his heart ablaze with the fire that keeps joy alive. For Jesus is that fire; everyone who draws near to it is set ablaze.

Hurtado’s password was quite simple – if your phones are turned on, I would like you to key this in. He asks: “What would Christ do in my place?” At school, at university, when outdoors, when at home, among friends, at work, when taunted: “What would Christ do in my place?” When you go dancing, when you are playing or watching sports: “What would Christ do in my place?”

He is the password, the power source that charges our hearts, ignites our faith and makes our eyes sparkle. That is what it means to be a protagonist of history. Our eyes sparkle, for we have discovered that Jesus is the source of life and joy. Protagonists of history, for we wish to pass on that sparkle to hearts that have grown so cold and gloomy that they have forgotten what it means to hope, to all those hearts that are “deadened” and wait for someone to come and challenge them with something worthwhile. Being protagonists means doing what Jesus did.

Wherever you are, with whomever you are with, and whenever you get together: “What would Jesus do?” The only way not to forget a password is by using it over and over. Day after day. The time will come when you know it by heart, and the day will come when, without realizing it, your heart will beat like Jesus’ heart.

It is not enough to hear a sermon or learn an answer from the catechism; we want to live the way Jesus lived. To do that, the young people in the Gospel asked: “Lord, where do you live?” (Jn 1:38). How do you live? We want to live like Jesus, with that “yes” that thrills our hearts. To put oneself on the line, to run risks. Dear friends, be courageous, go out straightaway to meet your friends, people you don’t know, or those having troubles.

Go out with the only promise we have: that wherever you are – in the desert, on the journey, amid the excitement, you will always be “connected”; there will always be a “power source”. We will never be alone. We will always enjoy the company of Jesus, his Mother, and a community. Certainly, a community is not perfect, but that does not mean that it does not have much to love and to give to others.
