Dear Parishioners,

1. True Humility and Talents

Some people think that humility is a matter of taking yourself to be small, unworthy, not up for much. But, in the Gospel parable, the servant who thinks he is too little to do much with his talent is dismissed as wicked and useless, and his talent is taken away from him. The Lord doesn't praise him for his humility.



So what is humility? It is the opposite of pride—but what is pride? Pride isn't thinking that there is some excellence, some talent, in yourself, when there really is. Rather, pride is a failure to recognize that talent as given by the Lord.

And so, of course, we are small and unworthy. What else would we be? Our talents are not a function of what we are and can do. Every excellence in us is a gift of the Lord's. We can acknowledge the excellence that is truly in us without danger of pride provided we remember that that excellence comes from the Lord.

Not only that, but in the Gospel our Lord announces a funny distribution principle: to him who has, more will be given. So here is the idea. A person who does not refuse a gift of the Lord's receives it and consequently has more. Then, because he has more, the Lord will offer him another gift. If he does not refuse that new gift, it will be given – and so he will have more. And then more will be given to him. And so on and on, till a person blazes in glory for the Lord.

Unlike the useless servant in the parable, then, we can aim as high as we like, with true humility, provided we recognize as gift every excellence we have. Everything is gift, and everything is meant to be given back in service of love for the Lord.

PILGRIMAGE SEPTEMBER 2015 TO FRANCE AND ITALY

Come join Fr Greg and Fr Bob on a 20 day pilgrimage to France and Italy. Start in Paris, then visiting Mont Saint Michel, Nevers, Lyon, Turin, Florence, Assisi, San Giovanni Rotondo, Amalfi coast and finish in Rome. On the way we will visit Notre Dame Cathedral, Eiffel Tower, Lisieux Carmelite Convent where St Therese lived, Chapel of the Apparitions, Cathedral of the Holy Shroud Turin, Molle Antonelliana, Santa Maria Novella, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Basilica St Francis, birthplace of Padre Pio, Abbey of Monte Cassino and many more, tourist attractions and places of worship.

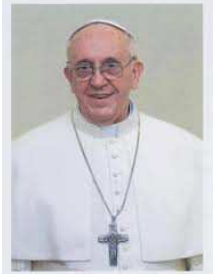

POPE FRANCIS' COLUMN



Pope Francis to World Leaders: Discarding Individuals Will Not Achieve Peace or Justice Sends Letter to Australian Prime Minister Ahead of G20 Summit in Brisbane

In a letter addressed to Prime Minister Tony Abbott of Australia, Pope Francis warned that a “mindset in which individuals are ultimately discarded will never achieve peace or justice.”

The letter was sent on the occasion of the upcoming G20 summit, which will take place this weekend in Brisbane, Australia. The Holy Father said that the meeting will provide an opportunity for the world to appreciate “Oceania’s significant contributions to the management of world affairs.” The Holy Father said that the upcoming meeting comes at a crucial time when the demands of steady employment need to be met by fair taxation and transparency in the financial sector. He also called on the heads of state and governments “not to forget that many lives are at stake behind these political and technical discussions.”

“Throughout the world, the G20 countries included, there are far too many women and men suffering from severe malnutrition, a rise in the number of the unemployed, an extremely high percentage of young people without work and an increase in social exclusion which can lead to criminal activity and even the recruitment of terrorists,” the Holy Father wrote.

“In addition, there are constant assaults on the natural environment, the result of unbridled consumerism, and this will have serious consequences for the world economy.”

Expressing his hope that a productive consensus can arise, the Pope commented on the current situation of global security and peace, particularly in the Middle East. He also called for a broader agreement between the countries, through the United Nations legal system, to end aggression against minorities, religious and ethnic groups.

The agreement, he said, should “lead to eliminating the root causes of terrorism, which has reached proportions hitherto unimaginable; these include poverty, underdevelopment and exclusion.”

The Pope also stated that there is a need for education, that religion may not be used to justify acts of violence.

“The situation in the Middle East has revived a debate about the responsibility of the international community to protect individuals and peoples from extreme attacks on human rights and a total disregard for humanitarian law,” he wrote.

“The international community, and in particular the G20 Member States, should also give thought to the need to protect citizens of all countries from forms of aggression that are less evident but equally real and serious.”

The Pope referred to what he called “abuses in the financial system” that led to the 2008 financial crisis. He warned that a mindset in which people are easily thrown aside “will never achieve peace or justice.”

“Responsibility for the poor and the marginalized must therefore be an essential element of any political decision, whether on the national or the international level,” he affirmed.

Concluding his letter, the Pope expressed his appreciation for Prime Minister Abbot’s work and conveyed his “prayerful encouragement” for the outcome of the G20 Summit
