Dear Parishioners,

1. Embodied Love

The Gospel reading for this week is very rich.

It invites us to reflect on the difference between true love and its false imitation, between real Christianity and its fake lookalike. It encourages us to exercise ourselves in the care of all God's children.

It prompts us to reflect on all the different kinds of hunger there are in the world, and the very different kinds of feeding those various hungers require.



These are all good things to ponder, but there is still more to see.

Here is one more thing.

Think about what it is for God himself to be incarnate. A human woman took the Lord to her breast and suckled him there. The apostle John reclined by the Lord and laid his head on the bosom of the Lord. A woman washed the Lord's feet with her tears, and a woman rubbed his feet with lotion. How did those people get so lucky? Of all the millions and millions of God's people, how can it be that so few touched God in the flesh, that only one woman anointed his feet? Wouldn't you have liked to be among these very lucky people?

It is good to have a God who enters human history, but anything in history is local, constrained in time and space, cut off from so many things that aren't right here, right now. How can it be that only those few people, who were there then with Jesus, had access to the Lord flesh to flesh? In desperately sad and stricken moments, what wouldn't you yourself have given to lay your weary head on the breast of your Lord?

The answer to these questions and the consolation the questions seek is in the Gospel reading: whatever you did to one of the least of my own, the Lord says, you did it to me.

PILGRIMAGE SEPTEMBER 2015

TO FRANCE AND ITALY

Come join Fr Greg and Fr Bob on a 20 day pilgrimage to France and Italy. Start in Paris, then visiting Mont Saint Michel, Nevers, Lyon, Turin, Florence, Assisi, San Giovanni Rotondo, Amalfi coast and finish in Rome. On the way we will visit Notre Dame Cathedral, Eiffel Tower, Lisieux Carmelite Convent where St Therese lived, Chapel of the Apparitions, Cathedral of the Holy Shroud Turin, Molle Antonelliana, Santa Maria Novella, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Basilica St Francis, birthplace of Padre Pio, Abbey of Monte Cassino and many more, tourist attractions and places of worship.

Dates for the pilgrimage are Tuesday 8th September 2015 in Paris and finishing on Sunday 27th September 2015 in Rome. Included are 19 breakfast and 15 dinners, plus all transfers. The estimated cost per person will depend on number traveling and will range from \$3612/person for group of 40, to \$4438/person for group of 25. Maximum numbers will be limited to 40. POPE FRANCIS' COLUMN



Pope at General Audience: Holiness Can Be Found in Ordinary Life Says All Christians Are Called to Become Saints

Pope Francis says every state of life leads to holiness, if lived in communion with the Lord and in the service of others.

During his weekly general audience this morning in St. Peter's Square, the Pope said that since holiness "is a gift that the Lord Jesus gives us, when He takes us to Himself, clothes us with Himself, and renders us like Himself," all of us can be saints.

Asking how we can realize our universal vocation to saints, he outlined three ways to do so. First, Christians must be reminded that holiness is not something that we procure for ourselves. Holiness, he said, is not something "that we obtain with our qualities and our capacities," rather it is gifted by God.

Outlining his second point, the Pope explained that all are called to holiness in their ordinary lives. "It is not necessary to be bishops, priests or religious," he said. "We are all called to become saints!"

"Very often, however, we are tempted to think that holiness is reserved only to those who have the possibility to detach themselves from ordinary tasks, to dedicate themselves exclusively to prayer. But it is not so! Some people think that holiness is closing your eyes and putting on a pious face... No! That is not holiness!"

Not a burden

Turning to the third point, he called on all faithful to do an examination of conscience, and to ask whether or how they have responded to the Lord's call to holiness. "When the Lord invites us to become saints, He does not call us to something burdensome, sad," he said.

The 77-year-old Pontiff said that God doesn't ask for Christians do something beyond our strengths but by little steps such as choosing not to gossip, spending time with their children, in prayer and giving to those in need.

"Small things are small steps toward holiness," he said. "And every step towards holiness will make us better people, free from selfishness and being closed in on ourselves, and open us up to our brothers and sisters and their needs."

Concluding his catechesis, the Pope echoed St. Paul's call for the faithful to be "good stewards of God's varied grace." The path towards holiness, he said, is not traveled on one's own. "It is traveled together, in the one Body that is the Church, loved and rendered holy by the Lord Jesus."
