1. Doctor without Borders

The international aid organization Doctors Without Borders has 27,000 medical personnel in 60 countries, and they bring essential medicines and medical care to very many people who otherwise would go without.



The medical science they use comes from the Western industrialized countries. But no one supposes that there is something exclusivist or arrogant or intolerant about Doctors Without Borders for bringing this medical care from the West to the poor and sick in third-world countries. On the contrary, in 1999 Doctors Without Borders won the Nobel Peace Prize for its work with the world's needy.

There is an objective truth about what will heal people, and the fact that modern medicine comes from the industrialized West doesn't alter this truth. Western medicine is prized around the world because it has a power to heal that nothing else does.

What Peter says about Christ in the First Reading is a little like this. There is a sickness of the spirit as well as of the body, and it can lead to death too, a death of the spirit rather than the body. There is healing for this spiritual sickness. But, Peter says, it comes only from Christ. Christ has a power to heal that nothing else does.

That is a lesson that the First Reading teaches. To some people, this lesson is worrisome, or worth rejecting. They think it is disrespectful to other cultures and religions.

But notice what Christ adds to this lesson in the Gospel. He has more than one fold of sheep, he says. In their varying countries, cultures, and ethnicities, all those who hear his voice and are glad of it form the different folds of sheep for whom Christ is the good Shepherd. All these differing folds together make up the one truly world-wide flock of the Lord.

And so there is one objective truth about what heals, whether the healing is medical or spiritual; and there is only one source for this healing. But, unlike modern medicine, the healing of Christ is not another monopoly of the Western industrialized nations. Whatever his social or ethnic group, whatever the way in which Christ's voice comes to him and moves him, each person whose heart is stirred by the voice of the Lord is included in Christ's one flock.

The ultimate doctor without borders is Christ.

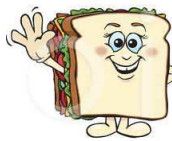

DAY 1 – TUE 08SEP - ARRIVAL IN PARIS, FRANCE. - Welcome to Paris! On arrival a group transfer will be provided to your overnight hotel.

DAY 2 – WED 09SEP – PARIS. - Sightseeing with a Local Guide features the Arc de Triomphe, Louvre, Champs-Elysees, and the EIFFEL TOWER, and much more.

DAY 3 – THU 10SEP – PARIS - LISIEUX EXCURSION. - Travel to Lisieux and visit the CARMELITE CONVENT, where St. Therese lived as a nun.

DAY 4 – FRI 11SEP – PARIS - MONT SAINT MICHEL. - This morning depart Paris for your scenic drive to the unique beauty of Mont St. Michel, which stands on an island reached by a causeway.

DAY 5 – SAT 12SEP - MONT SAINT MICHEL – NEVERS. - Today head south through the beautiful France countryside to Nevers, where you will visit the CONVENT OF ST GILDARD where St. Bernadette spent her life as a nun.

DAY 6 – SUN 13SEP – NEVERS - PARAY-LE-MONDIAL – LYON. - Depart Nevers and travel to Paray-le-Monial, home to the CHAPEL OF THE APPARITIONS and where Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

DAY 7 – MON 14SEP – LYON. - Today visit the BASILICA OF NOTRE-DAME DE FOURVIÈRE, constructed in the late 19th century, it has an ornate interior to contrast its grave exterior.

DAY 8 – TUE 15SEP – LYONS – TURIN, ITALY. - Today say au revoir to France and ciao to Italy! This afternoon in Turin, enjoy sightseeing with a Local Guide, admire the amazing 167 metre (548 foot-high) Mole Antonelliana, symbol of Turin, and walk through the historic centre to visit the CATHEDRAL that houses the Holy Shroud.

DAY 9 – WED 16SEP – TURIN. - Today is a day at leisure for you to enjoy the beautiful city of Turin, the capital of Piedmont and birthplace of the Fiat automobile. (B)

DAY 10 – THU 17SEP – TURIN - PISA– FLORENCE. - This morning, vistas of undulating hills, austere rows of cypress trees, terraced vineyards, olive groves, and rural villages form the backdrop of your journey through beautiful Tuscany. Stop in Pisa for a visit and see the Square of Miracles and the amazing Leaning Tower.

DAY 11 – FRI 18SEP – FLORENCE. - Today, enjoy a walking tour with a Local Guide, featuring most of the city highlights. You will see the Ponte Vecchio bridge, Santa Maria Novella, Piazza Santa Croce; the beautiful Piazza Signoria; the Palazzo Vecchio, and more.

DAY 12 – SAT 19SEP – FLORENCE. - Today visit what is believed to be the earliest museum in Europe. With a local guide you will be taken around the UFFIZI GALLERY, which is one of the most important art galleries in Italy displaying paintings from every age.

DAY 13 – SUN 20SEP – FLORENCE - SIENA– ASSISI. - Today, enjoy landscapes of rolling hills, austere rows of cypress trees, terraced vineyards, olive groves, and rural villages on the way to Siena, Tuscany's most beloved and inviting city.

DAY 14 – MON 21SEP – ASSISI. - Enclosed by ramparts and little changed since the Middle Ages, Assisi sprawls prettily across the slopes of Monte Subasio and retains its medieval character.

DAY 15 – TUE 22SEP – ASSISI – LORETO - LANCIANO - SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO. - This morning depart Assisi and head east towards the province of Ancona, visit the HOLY HOUSE OF LORETO, one of the most revered Marian shrines in the world.

DAY 16 – WED 23SEP - SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO. - Today visit THE SHRINE OF PADRE PIO, the second-most visited Catholic shrine in the world. It centres on the tomb of Saint Padre Pio of Pietrelcina, a Capuchin friar.

DAY 17 – THU 24SEP - SAN GIOVANI ROTONDO - PIETRALCINA – SORRENTO. - This morning head to Pietrelcina – the town that gave its name to the saint, Padre Pio of Pietrelcina.

DAY 18 – FRI 25SEP – SORRENTO – CASSINO – ROME. - This morning visit the AMALFI CATHEDRAL and see the Relics of the Apostle Andrew.

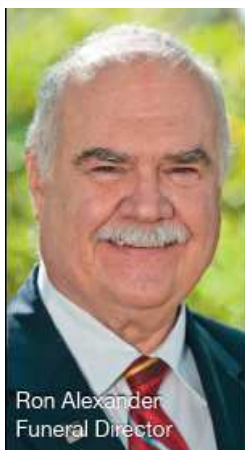

**MESSAGE OF POPE FRANCIS
FOR THE 52nd WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR
VOCATIONS**

Theme: Exodus, a fundamental experience of vocation

“On this 52nd World Day of Prayer for Vocations, I would like reflect on that particular “exodus” which is the heart of vocation, or better yet, of our response to the vocation God gives us. When we hear the word “exodus”, we immediately think of the origins of the amazing love story between God and his people, a history which passes through the dramatic period of slavery in Egypt, the calling of Moses, the experience of liberation and the journey toward the Promised Land...”

“At the root of every Christian vocation we find this basic movement, which is part of the experience of faith. Belief means transcending ourselves, leaving behind our comfort and the inflexibility of our ego in order to centre our life in Jesus Christ. It means leaving, like Abraham, our native place and going forward with trust, knowing that God will show us the way to a new land. This “going forward” is not to be viewed as a sign of contempt for one’s life, one’s feelings, one’s own humanity. On the contrary, those who set out to follow Christ find life in abundance by putting themselves completely at the service of God and his kingdom. Jesus says: “Everyone who has left home or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for my name’s sake, will receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life” (Mt 19:29). All of this is profoundly rooted in love. The Christian vocation is first and foremost a call to love, a love which attracts us and draws us out of ourselves, “decentring” us and triggering “an ongoing exodus out of the closed inward-looking self towards its liberation through self-giving, and thus towards authentic self-discovery and indeed the discovery of God”

“To hear and answer the Lord’s call is not a private and completely personal matter fraught with momentary emotion. Rather, it is a specific, real and total commitment which embraces the whole of our existence and sets it at the service of the growth of God’s Kingdom on earth. The Christian vocation, rooted in the contemplation of the Father’s heart, thus inspires us to solidarity in bringing liberation to our brothers and sisters, especially the poorest. A disciple of Jesus has a heart open to his unlimited horizons, and friendship with the Lord never means flight from this life or from the world. On the contrary, it involves a profound interplay between communion and mission

“Dear young friends, never be afraid to go out from yourselves and begin the journey! The Gospel is the message which brings freedom to our lives; it transforms them and makes them all the more beautiful. How wonderful it is to be surprised by God’s call, to embrace his word, and to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, in adoration of the divine mystery and in generous service to our neighbours! Your life will become richer and more joyful each day!”

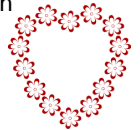
