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A Reflection by Fr Richard

Dear Parishioners.

In a modern parable, A man fell into a pit and he couldn't get out.

Buddha said: "Your pit is only a state of mind."

A Hindu said: "This pit is for purging you and making you more perfect."

Confucius said: "If you would have listened to me, you would never have fallen into

A new ager said: "Maybe you should network with some other pit dwellers." A self-pitying person said: "You haven't seen anything until you've seen my pit."

A realist said: "That's a pit."

An idealist said: "The world shouldn't have pits." An optimist said: "Things could be worse." A pessimist said: "Things will get worse."

There are many layers to this story of the Good Samaritan and a good deal of underlying humour. It is not simply that the Jews hated and despised the Samaritans and would have difficulty in accepting that a Samaritan would do such a good deed which two Jews (dedicated to the service of God) failed to do.

The two Temple officials were faced with a problem: if the crumpled figure lying there is dead, they will be defiled by touching him, and so unable to perform their sacred duties that day. Should they observe the Law or give help where help is needed? The Samaritan has no such worry and takes the injured man as his neighbour. In this case the Law is no help to serving a neighbour.

In this story Jesus shows us the way. "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself." Therefore, in your own pit, reach out to God - and through Christ - reach out to others around you and let them know that there is a better life to be lived - a life that is given freely to all who desire it.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Who is my neighbour?

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus, 'do this and life is yours.' But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him,' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go and do the same yourself.'

Reflection by Dianne Bergant

Although the gospel is a report of ministerial commissioning, it contains elements of discipleship in general. Most obvious is the disciples' dependence on Jesus. They are not independent missionaries; they are followers. Furthermore, there is a communal dimension of discipleship. While there is certainly a personal relationship between Jesus and each disciple, discipleship itself is not a singular privilege that one hugs to oneself to the exclusion of others. Disciples minister to the needs of others, whatever those needs may be and with whatever abilities the disciple may possess. There are various kinds of healing: a friendly smile, a word of gratitude, a soothing touch. We can teach the lessons of life in classrooms, in playrooms, in kitchens, in boardrooms. There are many ways that we can cast out the demons that hold our world by the throat; demons of poverty and oppression, demons of addiction and slavery, demons of disdain and neglect, demons of hatred and violence. If they are not cast out by us, then by whom? The life of discipleship is not an unmixed blessing. Because disciples are marked by the sign of the cross, they must expect suffering. Because they do not live according to the standards of the world, disciples will be judged as fools. Some of them will be subjected to even greater suffering. Still, the disciple proclaims that true fulfillment is only found in God! In reality, it is the world that is upside down, not the life of discipleship. And it is the cross that sets things right.
