A Reflection by Fr Richard

The New Liturgical Year begins with the First Sunday of Advent, which starts four Sundays before Christmas. Each year the Church tells the story of Jesus again. It is always the same yet ever new. In this Liturgical year, Cycle A, the Church meditates on the Gospel of according to Matthew and uses it for most of Sunday readings. Each year we ought to understand the story of Jesus better and make it more our own. It is a continual reminder to us of the meaning of our lives as we travel towards the Kingdom of God in the footsteps of Jesus.

Advent is a time of preparation with a twofold characteristic: a time of preparation for the solemnities of Christmas, in which the first coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second coming at the end of time.

As the first word of this Sunday of Advent from St Matthew, Christ tells us, "Stay awake! You must be prepared." The unprepared people "in the days of Noah" were distracted by their "eating and drinking," oblivious to the imminent flood. We are not any different from the people in Noah's time. There are so many distractions all around us. And besides, after 2000 years (of waiting), the spirit of anticipation has certainly dulled. However, the season of Advent invites us again and again to rediscover means of conversion.

Advent is a time for Conversion, to which the Liturgy at this time often refers quoting the prophets, especially John the Baptist, "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Mt 3:2). These are also days of joyful hope. Hopeful that the salvation already accomplished by Christ and the reality of grace in the world, will mature and reach their fulness, thereby granting us what is promised by faith, and "we shall become like him for we shall see him as he really is" (1 John 3:2).

Therefore, Advent is a time of active waiting, of expectation, of desire, of prayer, of evangelization, of joy.

The Liturgy: Place of Encounter with Christ

Here lies all the powerful beauty of the liturgy. If the resurrection were for us a concept, an idea, a thought; if the Risen One were for us the recollection of the recollection of others, however authoritative, as, for example, of the Apostles; if there were not given also to us the possibility of a true encounter with Him, that would be to declare the newness of the Word made flesh to have been all used up. Instead, the Incarnation, in addition to being the only always new event that history knows, is also the very method that the Holy Trinity has chosen to open to us the way of communion. Christian faith is either an encounter with Him alive, or it does not exist.

The Lord will gather all nations in

Gospel

Mt 24:37-44

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew **Stay awake, you must be ready.**

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Historical Context - The Advent Wreath



One of the major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God. There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle – celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.
