A Reflection by Fr Richard

Jesus declares, "I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full".

Vincent van Gogh spent many years trying to find out what he wanted to do with his life. After much searching, he discovered that he wanted to be a painter. From that day on his life changed. It wasn't that it suddenly became easy. The opposite would be nearer the truth. However, now that he had found his work, he no longer doubted himself, and no matter how difficult his life was, the inward serenity, and the conviction of his own calling, never deserted him.

On this Forth Sunday of Easter, Peter stands up with the Eleven and preaches about Jesus, our "Lord and Christ." When the people hear that it is by Christ's wounds that they have been healed, they themselves are "cut to the heart." They beg, "What are we to do, brothers?" They have found in the witness of the Apostles an authority they are eager to follow. This is what Jesus means when he says that the Good Shepherd walks ahead of his sheep, and that the sheep follow him "because they recognize his voice." With the image of the shepherd and the sheep gate, Jesus affirms how he would lead his followers into the Kingdom. And he would act as the gate to the divine realm.

We are the flock of the Lord. Our true vocation is to hear his voice and thereafter follow him. But, like sheep, we can wander off in our own direction. And be at the mercy of thieves and false Messiahs. Jesus brings us back, like a good shepherd. Jesus' purpose for us is that we (individually and collectively) have fullness of life. And he gives us a true way to the Father. His very self! How do you remain in the Lord's flock? Trust in Jesus and his way. That trust has changed you and continues to change you.

May Celebration in honour of Our Lady




The Sydney Archdiocese Committee of the World Apostolate of Fatima invite you to our May Celebration in

First Reconciliation - Parent Information Evening reminder

The Parent Information Evening for First Reconciliation is on **Wednesday**, **May 3 at 7.00pm** in the church (children do not need to attend this meeting).



At this meeting we will help parents to form groups, pick up programme books and pay for the program. The cost of the program is \$50.00 and can be paid by cash or credit card.

First Reconciliation preparation classes will be held on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evening at 7.00pm in the parish hall and will last one hour. Parents can choose to attend either Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday evening. There will be 4 classes, one each week, starting on Tuesday 16, Wednesday 17 and Thursday 18 May. Groups of no more than 6-8 (max) children for preparation groups.

Mass attendance during the program is required. The sacraments are an initiation into the Church and one of the basic features of our faith is that we gather on Sundays for Mass.

The sacrament of First Reconciliation will be celebrated in the church on **Thursday 15 June at 7.00pm**. Children who have celebrated their First Reconciliation can then go on to celebrate first Holy Communion in term 4.

First Reading

Acts 2:14, 36-41

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent.' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Peter You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and quardian of your souls.

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty. This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults: when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and quardian of your souls.

Gospel

Jn 10:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *I am the gate of the sheepfold.*

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.' Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.




So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'

Gospel Focus - Life to the Full

John 10:10 is a very famous quote from this gospel passage. Having life to the full does not imply life filled with every convenience, comfort and wealth. Rather, it is about living a life filled with purpose and intent. If we fail to live with purpose and meaning then our life is a hollow shell of what it could be. Jesus came that we may have life – a life that is at its fullest when it is lived in such a way as to be an expression of what Jesus taught and lived.


