A Reflection by Fr Richard

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ also known as Corpus Christi, calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church.

The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. It is in these holy gifts that Christ is most powerfully present for believers. By Christ's Word and the power of the Holy Spirit the bread and wine have been transformed. The consecrated bread and wine now bear the presence of Christ in a unique and unsurpassed way.

The secondary focus is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The use of the same phrase, "Body of Christ," for both the Eucharistic bread and for the Church points to a reciprocal relationship between them. This has been expressed in the saying, "The Church makes the Eucharist, and the Eucharist makes the Church" (Henri de Lubac).

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1391-1397), the fruits of the Eucharist include: an intimate union with Christ (the principal fruit), nourishment for the preservation, an increase and renewal of the life of grace received at baptism, cleansing of our past sins and preservation from future sins, strength for our charity, and unity within the Church.

New Planned Giving Envelopes




Please collect your 2023/2024 planned giving envelopes in the gathering space.

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

He gave you food which you and your ancestors did not know.

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart — whether you would keep his commandments or not. Gospel

Jn 6:51-58

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.*

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live forever;

and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'



Living the Gospel

Meals are very important events. Not only do we physically need food and drink to keep ourselves alive, but we use meals to mark occasions and celebrate events: birthdays; weddings; dates; achievements; disappointments; reunions. There is a sacredness about gathering with friends and family and sharing a meal together. Stories are told; memories shared; the food is appreciated and more often than not there's a drink to accompany the meal. Treating such occasions with gratitude – as blessed moments of grace – is living out the Eucharistic reality of welcoming Jesus into our lives and seeking to be more like him.

Gospel Focus - Real Presence

In the gospel passage, Jesus speaks a number of times about his followers eating his flesh and drinking his blood; 'For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.' In the Eucharist, we celebrate the 'real presence' of Jesus, understanding that bread and wine is changed into the body and blood of Christ. This change does not occur in a physical, observable way. The Church teaches that the 'substance' of bread and wine (what makes them bread and wine in essence) is changed but not the physical attributes. This is known as 'transubstantiation' – change of substance.






