A Reflection by Fr Richard

Najwa Zebian writes: "Don't break a bird's wings and then tell it to fly. Don't break a heart and then tell it to love. Don't break a soul and then tell it to be happy. Don't see the worst in a person and expect them to see the best in you...".

In a world darkened by sin and chaos, God chose Israel to be a light to the nations. They were called to be a kingdom of priests who were to reflect God's character to all nations. Sadly, the Jews usually looked down on pagans with marked contempt: they were the sons, the pagans were the dogs.

The terrible trial of a demonically tormented child could have wrecked the Canaanite woman's spirit, weighing her down with despondency and defeat. Jesus answered the afflicted woman repeating this well-known scornful saying of the Jews. "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs".

It may appear as if Jesus was trying to "break a bird's wings and then telling it to fly". Jesus said this not to disparage the woman like the Israelites usually did to foreigners but to test the woman's faith: would she insist when it appeared that even God would reject her? Her unwavering faith lifts her from the heaviness of hopelessness due to her daughter's situation. Jesus answered her, "'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again."

Coming to worship, we stand in the line of faith exemplified by the Canaanite woman. When our faith is put to a test, let us persist in our prayer. Our faith and trust in the Lord will never disappoint us because God can never "break our wings and then tell us to fly".

Church Roof Repairs Appeal

The roof repairs have been completed and only the leaf guards on the gutters are left to do. The leaf guards will help keep the gutters clear from all the eucalyptus tree leaves which constantly get washed into the gutters from the roof, causing blockages in the drain pipes. These blockages then cause the gutters to overflow resulting in the water flowing back into the church ceiling. As this work on the gutters is continuing this week, we ask that parishioners only enter and exit the church via the front doors and do not use the side doors at this time.

The Parish Finance Committee has requested a parish appeal be held to help pay for the repairs, which are estimated to be in the vicinity of \$30,000. Any donations, large or small, that parishioners could provide would be greatly appreciated.

He never ceases to surprise us!
