A Reflection by Fr Richard

The following famous prayer of St. Augustine can help us reflect on Jesus' teaching this week.

"Too late have I loved you, O Beauty so ancient, O Beauty so new. Too late have I loved you! You were within me but I was outside myself, and there I sought you! In my weakness, I ran after the beauty of the things you have made. You were with me, and I was not with you. The things you have made kept me from you – the things which would have no being unless they existed in you! You have called, you have cried, and you have pierced my deafness. You have radiated forth, you have shined out brightly, and you have dispelled my blindness. You have sent forth your fragrance, and I have breathed it in, and I long for you. I have tasted you, and I hunger and thirst for you. You have touched me, and I ardently desire your peace."

Jesus says "... tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you." Why? Because when they encountered Jesus Christ, they found in him everything they needed to be happy. As St. Augustine reiterates in his confessions, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

Too late had Augustine loved God. Perhaps, too late have we loved God. But we are reassured of God's goodness. If someone "turns from wickedness and does what is right and just, he shall surely live, he shall not die" (Ezekiel 18:25-28) - because that person has found Jesus Christ, who is infinitely

more attractive than the false delights of wickedness.



A reading from the prophet Ezekiel The sinner who decides to turn against sinfulness deserves to live.

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus.

For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'


