### A Reflection by Fr Richard

In the old days when a monarch had to travel through the wilderness where there was no road, a crew of workers would precede him, making the way passable for his chariot. In our times, many crooked roads have been made straight, many narrow roads have been widened, and many rough roads have been made smooth. All this has made travel easier and safer. But this is not what John the Baptist is talking about when he cries out, "prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight". The word 'way' or 'road' stands for a person's manner of life and conduct. The straight road stands for right living. The crooked road stands for wrong living.

John the Baptist preached repentance as a means to prepare for the coming Messiah. Preparing the way of the Lord is not just a temporary clean-up for the visitor, but an embracing of the new possibilities that are opening to us. Repent, for no one is good enough for the kingdom. Only a repentant heart can be received into the kingdom. And you can't get away with just a short-term repentance like kids being good for a few days before Santa comes, you've got to bear fruit worthy of repentance. Repentance basically means "turning around", "changing direction".

We're not being called to turn away from everything that's good in life. We're being called to turn away from that which has passed its use-by date, that which no longer gives life, that which would now just anchor us in irrelevance and decay. And more significantly we are being called to turn to something, called to embrace the new possibilities that are opening to us, to launch out with courage and grace into exciting new visions and hopes for the future. And the Christ who is born anew in every age will go with us always. During this second week of

Advent, may I resolve to live with an open, forgiving heart and bless others with my peaceful presence.

### **Announcement - Parish Council 2024**

As we approach 2024, Fr. Sebastian and Fr. Richard wish to thank the following past and present members of the All Hallows Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), who have served on the council since Fr Sebastian arrived. Thank you to Ann Kerley, Beatrice Lorquet, Vince Moschella, Wendy Volpatti, Josie Pappalardo, Chrissie Conti, Helen Elliott, Christine Torresan and Graham Hextell for their service and commitment to the Parish.



They also wish to announce their intention to renew the PPC in accordance with new guidelines developed by the Archdiocese of Sydney. This renewal will create an opportunity to clarify, promote and support the evangelising mission of the Parish and will ensure that our mission is exercised in fruitful collaboration and co-responsibility with laity.

Fr. Sebastian and Fr. Richard are requisite PPC members, there are two ex-officio members (the School Principal and one member of the Parish Finance Committee) and one appointed member (the Chairperson).

Fr. Sebastian therefore invites the recommendation of 4 elected parishioners to join the PPC to bring the total number of members to 9. Fr. Sebastian is beginning this process with a period of discernment and suggests that those recommended for membership of the renewed PPC have at least some of the following qualities:

- o A commitment to the practice of the faith, and the Parish community
- o An ability to collaborate and consult with others for the mission of the Church
- o Good communication and interpersonal skills
- o A capacity to think strategically toward the development of Parish plans for mission

Representation of women and men, diversity in age and pastoral experience will also be important. Parishioners should ensure that recommendations of another parishioner or of themselves should be made in writing with supporting reasons and contact details to Fr. Sebastian via the Parish Office or via email (pp@allhallows.org.au) by **COB Monday 18**<sup>th</sup> **December.** Fr. Sebastian will then prayerfully short list the recommended candidates and announce the next steps in the process.

### **First Reading**

### Isaiah 40:1-5. 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah **Prepare the way for the Lord.** 

'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness away for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

### 2 Peter 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St Peter

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up. Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

### Mark 1:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark *Make straight the paths of the Lord.* 

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'



### **Second Sunday of Advent - Hope**

The second Sunday in Advent continues on the path started in the first week by looking forward to Christ's first and second coming. This week focuses on John the Baptist, the Gentiles being included in God's family, Christ's coming in judgement and peace, and the church's hopeful expectation of the completion of his promises. The second Advent candle ("The Bethlehem Candle") is purple and represents peace. Peace is a central theme of the Advent season but the main focus of the second week of Advent.






# JOHN THE BAPTIST
